

Bloodborne Pathogen Exposure Prevention

To be compliant, you must also:

- Identify who the employees should contact with questions
 - Report to office for actual or suspected exposure. The office will assist you with completing any paperwork to be submitted to Risk Management
 - Contact administrator and report exposure
 - If unsure if constitutes exposure contact Health Services at 209-858-0782 to speak with a school nurse.
 -
- Specify where the exposure control plan is located and how to access.
 - Exposure plan is located in the site office.
 - Office staff can provide location information
- Explain any locally specified PPE (type, use, limitations, location, removal, handling, decontamination, disposal)
 - Latex or vinyl gloves will be available to each teacher as needed in the office.
 - Office staff will provide small packets of gloves and Band-Aids at the beginning of each school year.
 - Instant hand Sanitizing Wipes are available in the office (office staff can order from warehouse)
 - Germicidal Disposable cloths are available in the office (office staff can order from warehouse)
 - Large biological waste spills will be cleaned by train staff and disposed of per OSHA regulation.
- Offer a Hepatitis B vaccination/declination form
 - Health Services will determine if an employee is considered at risk for potential exposure.
 - If identified as at risk the employee will be offered immunization for HBV. The employee may sign a declination form if they wish.
 - Those records will be kept in Health Services.

- Provide specific procedures to follow in an exposure incident - who to contact, medical follow-up

- Contact administrator and report exposure
- Site to report to Risk Management – (209) 858-0860
- Employee will make contact with Occupational Health Medical provider listed on documentation to request medical evaluation.
- Occupational Health will determine if treatment needed for exposure and offer Hepatitis B immunoglobulin
